

Targeting the Hardcore Poor (THP): An evidence and need-based livelihood and empowerment programme for vulnerable families

The Targeting the Hardcore Poor Model (THP) - Learnings from India and Abroad

Across the globe, it is evident that sustainable livelihood is a proven medium for empowerment of the vulnerable and ultra-poor communities and households. It is a key to improving quality of life, gaining social security, and moreover, leading a life with dignity with hope for a better future.

One such promising approach, the 'Graduation programme' or the Targeting the Ultra Poor (TUP) programme pioneered by BRAC in Bangladesh, helps the ultra-poor women in rural areas attain sustainable livelihoods by providing a combination of carefully sequenced services including transferring a productive asset, training, consumption support, and mentoring with the ultimate goal of empowering and helping them "graduate" out of extreme poverty over a period of about 24 months. The model and approaches adopted therein in countries including Ethiopia, Ghana, Honduras, India, Pakistan and Peru were evaluated by Abdul Latif Jameel Poverty Action Lab (J-PAL) in 2006. Findings broad and lasting economic impacts including increased consumption, growth in assets and increased savings of households. Long-term follow-ups in India and Bangladesh, suggest that the impact has been even bigger after seven years.

In India, Bandhan-Konnagar adapted the model, successfully piloted it, and has implemented it in nine states since 2006 through its 'Targeting the Hard-core Poor' (THP) programme', covering nearly 71,000 ultra—poor households. Randomised evaluation of the effectiveness of the programme conducted by J-PAL in 2006 in Murshidabad, West Bengal, re-iterated the previous findings in context of India also. One year after the program ended—three years after receiving the assets—program participants on average had significantly more assets and savings, spent more time working, went hungry on fewer days, and experienced lower levels of stress and improved physical health compared to those who did not receive the program.


The program was also cost effective, with positive returns in five of six countries, ranging from 133 percent in Ghana to 433 percent in India. In other words, for every dollar spent on the program in India, ultra-poor households had \$4.33 in long-term benefits.



THP Programme in Jharkhand

The Department of Scheduled Tribe, Scheduled Caste, Minority and Backward Class Welfare is implementing the THP in collaboration with Bandhan-Konnagar and J-PAL, South Asia since May 2017 in four blocks from Dumka and West Singhbhum Districts. At present, 2000 households are being covered with funding of INR 4.71 crores. Special focus is on Schedule Tribe and Particularly Vulnerable Tribes in the state.

About 1.4 crore women-headed households in India are living in extreme poverty and deprivation. In rural Jharkhand, out of the 5,27,273 women headed households3,69,703 (approx. 70%) are considered deprived. Among them, 1,50,652 households fall under three or more deprivation indicators.



Objectives, Approach and Outcomes envisaged

The overarching objective THP is to build sustainable sources of income and graduate 2000 households out of extreme poverty by April 2019.

A holistic approach has been adopted to enables the selected beneficiaries/ households to graduate out of spiral of poverty and deprivation by becoming self-reliant by attaining adequate food security, nutrition, and education for children, livelihood development and access to other social security programmes in a period of 24months

The outcomes envisaged are as follows:

- Rise in income upto INR 3,600 per month through sustained selfemployment
- Improve nutritional status families to have at least 2 full meals a day
- Beneficiaries able to save regularly, at least INR 350 quarterly; linkages for SHGs
- Growth in asset value up to INR 20,000
- Children (0 5 age group) of beneficiaries received full immunisation
- Enrollment and retention of children (6 14) years in school
- Improved quality of life through better housing, sanitation and drinking water facilities
- Access to public health (including 100% institutional delivery); social security schemes

Konnagar to support beneficiaries across key interventions

Criteria for selection of beneficiaries

- is headed by physically able tribal woman (including PVTG);
- bereft of adequate food security; ex- not having two square meals a day;
- · does not have any productive asset;
- does not have an economically active male member(16-59 years) in the family;
- has not been involved in any MFI or any credit giving NGO; and
- has not receive any substantial support from any government welfare programme/ intervention

Gains for beneficiaries

- Total asset value increased by 63.04%
- Post-intervention monthly income is approximately INR 3000 to INR 5.500
- Widowed women (710) receive Widow Pension through convergence
- Reduced absenteeism and retention among school going children of beneficiaries
- Improved financial literacy and regular savings being done
- Majority are accessing public health services, have built sanitary latrines
- Overall quality of life has improved

Achievements of THP till 31st July 2018

- Total 2,000 ultra-poor women headed households, including 120 PVTG selected and 3 day training completed for all
- 151 VACs formed and are supporting THP actively across interventions
- Enterprises selected and assets transferred to all beneficiaries. Majority beneficiaries opted for piggery, goatary, sal leaves plate making, bamboo craft, grocery / varieties stores, tailoring, mat making, rope making, etc.
- Weekly household visits and group meetings are continued
- Refresher training initiated for beneficiaries, after completion of six to eight months of programme intervention for further capacity building



Name : Diyugee Banra

Age : 33 years

Rising above vulnerability through hard work and determination

The story of Diyugee Banra, resident of Tanibasa village in Asura Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani block, is indeed a touching one. She was born in a very poor family and studied up to class IX. At the tender age of 14, she was married to Harish Banra working in a company at Chaibasa. Just as the couple was about to start a new life. Harish met with an accident and was severely injured. His condition deteriorated and since he was unable to do any kind of productive work, he lost the job. Unable to support the family, both Divugee and Harish eventually became a burden to their in-laws. and they separated the helpless couple from the family. With no other option left, Diyugee returned to her father's home with her husband and engaged in daily labour to sustain her family.

Diyujee was introduced to THP Programme through the staff, and selected as a beneficiary. Along with other beneficiaries, she was imparted the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training. Post training, based on her capabilities, skills and understanding of microenterprise management, she was given an option to choose an enterprise for income generation activity. She chose to set up a "Varieties Store".

She was provided assets worth Rs. 10034/- for her store in the month of October 2017. The program staffs continued regular mentoring and hand holding for stabilizing and growth of her enterprise, thereby leading to graduating out of abject poverty.

In addition to managing her enterprise, Diyugee regularly attends the weekly group meetings, where she gains knowledge on social issues, enterprise development and business skills. By July 2018. her asset value increased to Rs. 35989/- and her monthly income stands at Rs. 6178/-. She has also opened a bank account and has a savings of Rs. 13352/-. She saves regularly in a piggy bank and deposits the savings in bank account every three months. She now is able to provide two full nutritious meals to her family. THP staff has also supported her in availing social security benefits under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yoina (PMSBY) scheme and accessing public health service. She has aadhaar card and job card also. THP interventions have not only empowered Divugee but also brought dignity and a better life to her entire family.



Name: Subni Sawaiyan

Age : 49 years

Proper mentor and guidance can change the world

Subni Sawaiyan lives in Kelende village in Kelende Gram
Panchayat of Jhinkpani block.
Born in an socio-economically disadvantaged family, she did not have opportunity to complete even upper primary school and dropped out. Married to Turam, a daily wager at the age of 13 years, a very tough life awaited Subni.

Subni's husband was addicted to alcohol and did not take responsibility for the family with two children. Over a period, he also contracted TB and his condition deteriorated day by day. It was distressful situation for her. In addition to taking care of children and ailing husband, she was compelled to take up labour work to fend for the family. Since the financial needs kept

increasing, she was unable to meet the expenses through her meagre income. The spiral of poverty and misery engulfed her family.

However, her situation changed through the support under THP. Once selected as beneficiary under the programme and completing training on Confidence Building and Enterprise Development, she took up rope making and goat rearing as enterprise of choice in November 2017 She was provided assets worth Rs. 1574 for sabai grass rope making and Rs. 9940 for buying 5 goats. Weekly meetings further helped her to hone her skills in managing micro-enterprises and the THP staff also supported by mentoring and guiding in person for smooth running of the enterprise. With the consistent support, she has been able to increase the total value of assets to Rs. 13750/-, number of goats has increased from 5 to 7 while monthly income is about Rs. 3500/-. It is expected that the income will further continue to rise.

Apart from the assured income, she is gaining financial literacy through SHG activities, make regular savings and avail social security benefits as required. With gradual improvement in overall quality of life, Subni and her family will have a much better life in the near future.



Neeta Deogam, a beneficiary of THP lives in Bingtopang village in Tutugutu Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani block. She was born in a very vulnerable family. Having dropped out of class VI, she was married to Gora Deogam when she was barely 15 years old,. Gora worked as daily wager for living. On his way to work one day, he met with an accident and suffered severe injuries to both legs, leading to permanent handicap. As a result. Neeta had to shoulder the responsibility to take care of the family. To cope up with the situation, she took to daily labour as a means of livelihood

With lack of education or any particular skill, she had very

limited scope for leading a better life. Finally, THP changed her life. Neeta received the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training and she expressed desire to set up a grocery enterprise. Judging her determination and capacity to run an enterprise, she was provided grocery items worth Rs. 10434/-, enough to set up a store at her home itself. This was coupled by consistent on-site guidance and support by the THP staff.

Gradually, the enterprise stabilized, and by July 2018, the value of assets increased to Rs. 28190/-. with average monthly income is Rs. 6807/-. She has also opened a bank account and

makes a daily savings in a piggy bank which in every quarter she deposits in her savings account. Presently, she has a bank balance of Rs. 2000/-.

Attending the weekly group meetings and being an active member of SHG is also helping her to gain financial literacy, raise confidence and boost her morale. With adequate food security and means to access social security services, Neeta and her husband are able to live a comfortable life with renewed hope.



Name : Kairo Buiruly

Age : 45 years

Determination and hard work led to steady progress

Resident of Ichapur village in Kelende Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani block, Kairo Buiruly, was born in a very economically vulnerable family. Deprived of even primary education, she was married at the age of tender age of 16 years to Mathura Buirily, a daily wager. Unfortunately, after 5 years of marriage, her husband passed away due to cardiac arrest, leaving her to fend for herself with a small child She started working as a daily labourer, the only livelihood option available for her at that time

In 2018, Kairo was selected as a beneficiary under the THP Program. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose an enterprise and also on the basis of her capacity and understanding. / Considering the local demand and scope, she expressed interest in vegetable and goat rearing. Accordingly, she was provided vegetables worth Rs. 2384/- and 3 goats for Rs. 6500/- in the month of November 2017. Along with this support, the program staff continued to mentor and handhold her to ensure that the enterprise is managed well. Weekly group meetings also helped her to hone skills.

At present, she owns 9 goats worth Rs. 12960/-. Her total asset value is Rs. 14988/- and her monthly income is Rs. 5219/-. With increased awareness about financial literacy through SHG, she has started saving regularly. Her bank balance is Rs. 8015/-. THP has also facilitated access to social security measures. Will all these integrated interventions, Kairo is now able to lead a comfortable life with her child





Name: Nishputi Buriuly

Age : 40 years

Undaunted spirit shows the

way

Born in an economically disadvantaged family, Nishputi Buriuly was deprived of even basic primary education and had to drop out of school to support in domestic responsibilities. At the age of 15. she was married to Mangal Singh Buruily from Tanibasa village in Asura Gram Panchavat of Jhinkpani block. Eventually, they had two children. In the meantime, her husband got addicted to alcohol and later he also contracted Tuberculosis. Lack of appropriate treatment and care claimed his life

However, the family continued to pull on with hand-to-mouth existence. Soon after her elder son married and separated from the family, and the younger one was studying in class X. Since elder son separated, Nishputi was rendered completely helpless. To keep her younger son and herself

going on, she began working as a daily wager at the age of 40 years.

It was after enrolling in THP that her situation changed. She was selected under THP after appropriate assessment and underwent the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training. This gave her an orientation about setting up her own micro-enterprise for a dignified livelihood. Post training, Nishputi received support of assets for fast food business (Rs. 6000) and sheep rearing (Rs. 4000 for 2 sheep) in October 2017. In addition to providing the assets, the THP staff also extended support to her for auiding in running and expanding her micro-enterprises. With hard work and determination, Nishputi has been able to enhance the value of assets for fast food centre to Rs. 12327/- and has 6 sheep

worth Rs. 10,000/-/. She is able to generate a monthly income of Rs. 4000 at present, and is likely to grow over a period as her enterprises gain more root. Credit for success of her enterprise is also attributed to the information and awareness gained through the weekly meetings regarding business skills and enterprise development.

Nishputi is also a member of SHG group, saves regularly and avails public health and social security services as and when needed. As a result, Nishputi has food security, assured monthly income and and better quality of life. Her son has been able to pursue education, which probably may not have been possible. She and her son thus have scope for leading a better and more dignified life going ahead.



Name : Saraswati Hasda

Age : 41 years

Overcoming vulnerability with determination

Saraswati Hasda, lives in
Matagutu village in Tutugutu
Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani
block. Having born in a family
with abject poverty, she never
had a chance to attend school.
This child labourer was married
to Shyam Hasda at the age of 17,
who worked as a daily wager.

Saraswati borne four children, two sons and two daughters. With 6 people to feed, it was indeed a challenge to meet the needs through meagre income of daily wages. The situation further worsened when her husband fell from a tree and had severe injury in vertebra, which nearly crippled him. With this condition, it was impossible for him to take up any productive task, leave

alone labour work. Saraswati had not alternative but to work as a labourer once again, having no other skills or knowledge for livelihood.

It was through THP that her family could see better days. After being selected as a beneficiary, she was imparted the Confidence Building and Enterprise
Development training, post which chose piggery and poultry as an income generation activity. In December 2017, she was provided assets including 2 pigs of Rs. 5000/- and 5 birds for Rs. 1000/-for poultry. The handholding support of THP and learnings through the weekly group meetings helped her to grow her

enterprise. At present, she has 7 pigs of valued at Rs. 14000/- and 6 hens. She has also built a shed for her livestock. Being a member of SHG group, she has learnt to save regularly. THP staff has helped her gain access to public health services and has been enrolled under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) scheme. She also has Aadhaar card, ration card and voter ID.



Name: Suru Purty

Age : 35 years

Extreme hardships and sacrifice leads to bright

future

Suru Purty, has led a very pitiful life. She lives in Tutugutu village in Tutugutu Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani block. Born in a large family as eldest daughter with three more sisters, they led a hand-to-mouth existence She lost her father to Cancer at a very early age. Abject poverty compelled her to drop out of school in class II to shoulder domestic responsibilities initially, and then a child labourer to support her family. In spite of all the hardships and extreme sacrifice, she managed all the responsibilities with indomitable spirit. She also had her three sisters married. While discharging all these responsibilities, she herself was

left unmarried and now lives with her old mother.

Suru's life finally changed as she came under the fold of THP. Having received the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training, she chose to take up rope making enterprise from sabai grass and goat rearing as a means of livelihood in December 2017. Under the programme interventions, she was given sabai grass of Rs. 1634/for rope making and 4 goats of Rs. 7600/-.

With hard work and persistence and support of THP staff, she continued to grow her small enterprise. As a result, the asset in rope making is valued at Rs. 2474/- and has 6 goats with value of Rs. 10960/-. Her average monthly income is Rs. 3640/-. She attends the weekly group meetings regularly, which has also aided in gaining more skills and knowledge for better management of her enterprise. Since she is member of SHG group, she has learnt to save regularly and is also learning about financial literacy. With perineal food security and access to social security services, Suru and her mother are able to lead a reasonably quality life.



Name : Tulsi Buriuly
Age : 30 years

Facing the fate through hard work and determination

Tulsi Buriuly, resident of Matagutu village, Tutugutu Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani block was born in a deprived family like most of the other THP beneficiaries. Married to Selay, a driver, at a tender age of 13 years, Tulsi found herself in a very challenging situation within 4 -5 years of marriage. Since she could not conceive, her husband deserted Tulsi and remarried Since she could not return to her parents also, Tulsi was left to fend for herself. The only option she had for livelihood was labour work

However, Tulsi found a hope to live a better life after enrolling in THP. Once selected as a

beneficiary, Tulsi underwent the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training. Post this, she expressed desire to set up a "Varieties Store" as a micro-enterprise. During November 2017, she was provided requisite support for the purpose in form of assets worth Rs. 8334/and regular handholding support and guidance by THP staff to run her enterprise smoothly. Attending weekly meetings also helped her to enhance her understanding of business and enterprise management. By July 2018, her enterprise took off well and presently, asset value has increased to Rs. 14950/- and her monthly income is Rs. 4000/-. This is adequate for her at present

to take care of basic needs of Tulsi, still leading a life of single, deserted women

Having joined an SHG Group, financial literacy of Tulsi has improved and she makes regular savings. Since she now has food security, access to sanitation and health services and can avail social security services also, her quality of life has improved significantly.



Name : Sukhmati Buruily

Age : 34 years

Life took a positive turn

Sukhmati Buruily was born in a very poor family. She was just 15 years of age and studying in class VIII, when she was married to Jairam Buruily, working as a daily labour. With her husband and four children she lived in Matagutu village in Tutugutu Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani block.

However, her family was probably not destined to lead a normal life. Her husband had an attack of paralysis. Sukhmani began working as a daily wager to support her large family and also nursed her husband. Her eldest child tried to help with domestic responsibilities. After 4 years of suffering by entire family, Jairam passed away. However,

the hardships knew no bound since her meagre income from intermittent labour work was not adequate for meeting the needs of her growing children. bounds. Gradually, they struggled to have even two meals a day.

Situation of Sukhmati saw a sea change after she was extended the benefits through THP during July 2017. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training, she chose goat rearing and poultry as her enterprise for means of livelihood. In the month of November 2017, she was provided 6 goats worth Rs. 11500/followed by 4 birds for poultry. In order to help her learn the

skills for both activities, THP staff visited her regularly, provided technical inputs and imparted skills to manage the enterprise over a period. Weekly group meetings also helped her gain more knowledge and sharpen skills, as well as learn from experience of other beneficiaries.

Efforts and Sukhmani and THP staff began rendering results. She now has 9 goats and total asset value is worth Rs. 15580/-. The quality of life has improved since she makes regular savings, gained better financial literacy through SHG, built sanitation facilities at home and has access social to social security measures if required.



Name : Jayshree Buruily

Age : 40 years

Leading a dignified life with

determination

The case of Jayshree Buruily, is that of determination and grit, worth following by many others like her. Born in a very poor family and deprived of education beyond class VII, she was married at the age of 14 years to Vishnu, a daily wager in in Matagutu village of Tutugutu Gram Panchayat in Jhinkpani block.

The couple, now with a child, lived a subsistence level life with meagre income of Vishnu. 9 years after marriage, situation worsened after. The disease finally claimed his life, leaving behind helpless Jayshree and a child. Devoid of any particular skills, barely literate Jayashree took to labour work for livelihood. However, life grew difficult as no

work was available during lean period and she and her child could barely have two meals a day.

Enrollment in THP in July 2017 turned out to be a turning point in her life. Considering her capacity to run a micro-enterprise of her own, she was provided support to set up a grocery shop at her home itself. She received grocery items worth B 9334/- in November 2017. The THP staff provided handholding support to manage the shop and allied functions appropriately. Gradually, her enterprise grew steadily and present asset value has increased to Bs 30593/- and cash in hand is Rs. 6922/-. Monthly income is about Bs 5160

Further, attending weekly group meetings has helped her learn about social issues, enterprise development and business skills. Being a member of SHG group, also contributed to certain behavior change. She saves regularly, accesses public health services and also built a sanitary latrine. Having secured Aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card, she is in a position to access social security schemes if need be With all these interventions, Jayashree and her child are able to lead a better quality of life.



Name : Gurubari Lugun

Age : 50 years

Age is not a bar, but
benchmark for success

Gurubari Lugun, lives in Badubasa village in Kudahatu Gram
Panchayat of Jhinkpani block.
She was born in a very such a deprived family that she could not even attend school. Married at age of 13 years to Jambira Lugun, a firewood collector, she had very limited hope to lead a better life. With two sons and two daughters to take care of, they led a life of abject poverty. Situation worsened when her husband was bitten by snake while collecting firewood and lost his life shortly.

Gurubari was in great distress and found herself in a dire situation finding it difficult to secure even minimal food for her children. She took to labour work to keep her family going. In spite of the hardships, she was able to her all four children. However, her sons mercilessly deserted Gurubari after they were marriage. At the

This was coupled with regular visits by staff to support in managing the enterprise and weekly meetings to provide additional inputs and motivation to keep going.

In spite of the old age and other vulnerabilities, Gurubari

has been able to catch up with the enterprise/ Her vegetable enterprise asset value has increased to Bs 8500/- and she has now 6 goats of value Rs. 15600/-. Her monthly income is Rs. 5130/-, enough to ensure food security, suffice her few needs and make regular savings. Through SHG, she learnt about financial literacy and has been able to save Rs. 6000/-. THP staff has also supported her to gain access to public health services. enroll under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) scheme and secure aadhaar card, ration card, job card and voter card. She is also getting widow pension. With all these social security measures, Gurumani is living independently with head held high at the fag end of her life.

Jano Kui. 40. is resident of Jorapokhar village in Jorapokhar Gram Panchayat of Jhinkpani block. Born in a poor household. she had a very little hope of living a good life. Having dropped out in class VI and married at the age of 17 to Jantur Munda, a daily wager, she continued to live in abject poverty as before. The difference was that now she also had two children to take care of. As if this was not enough, the real blow came when her husband was named in a water scam with other villagers and was brutally murdered. With two children to feed, she barely could mourn, and took to labour work

During December 2017, she had a hope for better life when she was

selected as a beneficiary under the THP Program. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose an enterprise and also on the basis of her capacity and understanding. She was confident about running a Varieties Store for livelihood. Considering the same, she was provided assets worth Rs. 8924/-. The program staff provided mentoring and hand holding support to manage the enterprise on weekly basis. In addition to this, the weekly group meetings she attended were also helpful in raising her awareness on social issues, enterprise development and business skills.

All the above resulted into a successful enterprise, with asset value nearly doubling to Rs. 16629/- and her average monthly income amounting to Rs. 6280/-. She has also opened a bank account and has a savings of Rs. 5860/-. She has developed a regular savings habit in a piggy bank and deposits in bank on quarterly basis. With regular income, access public health services, enrollment under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) scheme and support for securing aadhaar card, ration card, voter card, job card, etc. Jano is not only able to lead a quality life but also hopes for a brighter future for her children.

Finally, in December 2017, she was provided assets including 5 goats and 5 hens for poultry worth Rs. 11900/-. With her hard work, guidance and support of THP staff and inputs through the weekly meetings, she nurtured her enterprise with utmost care and dedication.

As a result, at present, she has 8 goats and 10 hens, amounting to an asset value of Rs. 17440/- and has built a shed for her livestock. Through support of THP, she

has also opened a bank account and has a savings of Rs. 2000/-. She has access to public health services. She also has Aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card which would help her avail social security measures if need be

Since there was no one to take care of her mother. she decided to stay single, curbing dream to have her own family, as any other girl of her age would wish for

Her hardships finally gave way when she was selected as a

beneficiary in the THP Program. After receiving the training in Confidence Building and Enterprise Development, aligned with the programme criteria, she chose grocery enterprise for her livelihood. She was given grocery items worth Rs. 11994/-. This was coupled with on-site mentoring and handholding support by the THP staff as well as guidance through the regular weekly meetings. THP staff also helped her to access social security measures. She also joined SHG group, which enabled her to gain financial literacy and gain insights in social issues.

As a collective impact of all the above, Gayatri's enterprise has

stabilized and she is doing well. Her asset value has increased to Rs. 17178/- and her monthly income is Rs. 3623/- and likely to improve further. Above all, she is empowered to lead a happier life like never before.

selected as a beneficiary in the THP Program. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose a suitable enterprise. Her capacity was also judged and finally she was provided readymade garments enterprise. She was given readymade garments worth Bs 11848/- She was guided for running her enterprise successfully both by the staff and members of the weekly meeting. She sold the readymade garments in nearby villages, making a reasonable profit.

Suru's hard work has paid off, and her asset value has increased to Rs. 15092/-, while current monthly income is Rs. 3332/-. Having joined an SHG group, she has also learned to make regular savings. Mamta's life changed for good when she was selected as a beneficiary under the THP Program. Post Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training, she was given various options to opt for as a means of livelihood Given her interest and skills, she was provided assets worth Rs. 11994/for setting up a varieties store in the month of December 2017 Along with the assets, regular mentoring and hand holding support was also provided to help her run her enterprise. The weekly group meetings also served as a platform to gain knowledge about social issues and business skills

Mamta's enterprise grew steadily with hard work. Presently her asset value has increased to Rs 15038/- and her monthly income is Rs. 3128/-. She has also opened a bank account and has a savings of Rs. 3500/-. She saves regularly and deposits the amount in the bank on quarterly basis. She is also a member of the SHG group, has been enrolled under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) scheme and accessing public health services. She has aadhaar card, ration card. voter card and job card also. 32 year old Mamta hopes to further grow her business, impart good education to her children and live a much better life

At an early age she was married to Moran Singh Munda, who sold firewood for making a living. Unfortunately, her husband was deeply injured after he fell off a tree, crippling him for lifetime. She was in a dire need of work to and had no other option than working as a daily wager, that too with irregular income.

Kunimai's situation changed after enrolling in THP. She received the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training in December 2017, post which she was provided assets including 6 goats and 5 hens for poultry, worth Rs. 12900/-. In addition, she also received handholding support from the staff, inputs through weekly meeting, financial awareness through SHG she joined and access to social security measures.

All the intervention gradually began rendering expected results.

She now has 9 and 10 hens, amounting to an asset value of Rs. 23595/-. She has also built shed for her livestock and takes care of them as instructed by the THP staff. Given the trend, the staff is positive that she will continue to do better in future also and become a role model for budding entrepreneurs like her.

trade and over a period, her asset value increased to an amount of Rs. 19750/- and her monthly income is Rs. 3085/-.

Having joined an SHG, she opened a bank account and makes a daily savings in a piggy bank and deposits in bank on quarterly basis. With support of THP, she also gained access to social security provisions. Her income enables her to meet the needs of the family and all her 4 children are attending school regularly. With hope of growing the business, she is expected to lead a better life

She began working as a daily wager.

After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose an enterprise and also on the basis of her capacity, skills and understanding. When she expressed interest in business of selling pulses and goat rearing, she was provided assets worth Rs. 11804/- and 3 goats in the month of December 2017. She received continued support through the THP staff and weekly meetings.

She is persistently working towards growing her enterprise. Presently her asset value is Rs. 12592/- and her monthly income is Rs. 5080/-. She has also opened a bank account and has a savings of Rs. 3000/-. Having gained

After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose an enterprise which will suit her. Based on assessment of her capacity to independently run a micro-enterprise, she was provided assets of Rs. 8994/- for fast food business and 5 hens for poultry as a means of livelihood. She was able to grow her business over a short period since she also received technical support from the THP staff and guidance from

weekly meetings. She also began saving (and making quarterly deposits in bank) after realizing importance of the same through SHG she joined. In addition, the staff also helped her gain access to social security measures and public health services.

With all the support, Golmai's business grew and the total asset value is Rs. 13817/- with a monthly income of Rs. 2621/-. This suffices for the food security, and she continues to work hard so that her family has a better quality of life going ahead.

He stopped sending money home to Mati and finally deserted her. Helpless and miserable, Mati started working as a daily wager and domestic help, whichever was available to keep her children going. In lean season, she migrated to

West Bengal to work in the brick kilns. She was struggling hard to sustain her family.

It was through THP that life took a positive turn. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she chose grocery enterprise for her livelihood. She was given grocery items worth Rs. 11934/-.

Thanks to the hand holding support of staff, weekly meetings, support of SHG group, access to social security, etc., her socioeconomic status has improved significantly. She is no longer required to migrate for labour work. Presently her asset value increased to Rs. 22311/- and her monthly income grew upto is Rs. 6030/-. All her 3 children are attending school regularly, something she would not have foreseen with meagre income prior to THP. All of them now together live a much stable life, a boon in itself.

The program staff also visits her home weekly basis for asset follow up and monitors her business growth. She attends the weekly group meeting, where she gains knowledge on social issues, enterprise development and business skills

Presently her asset has increased to staggering fourfold amount of Rs. 46.219/- and her monthly income is Rs. 9546/-. Soon after, Hende was identified as a beneficiary under the THP Program. She underwent the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training. After attending the programme, she was interested in vegetable and goat rearing. Accordingly, she was provided vegetables worth Rs. 3994/- and 2 goats for Rs. 4180/-. The program staff ensured continued support and mentoring to manage the enterprise successfully. In addition to this, the weekly meetings helped her

raise awareness on social issues. enterprise development and business skills. At present, her asset value has enhanced to Bs 16855/- and she has 4 goats. She has a steady, average monthly income is Rs. 3036/-. which is further expected to rise over a period as her enterprise expands. She has also opened a bank account and saves regularly. Her present bank balance is Rs. 4673/-She is also a member of the SHG group, has secured aadhaar card, ration card, job card and voter card.

Rising above poverty with

hard work

Sarita Buruily lives in Rajanka village in Choya village in Choya Gram Panchayat of Tonto block. Born in a very poor family, her father was a daily wager. In spite of this, she completed matriculation successfully. Unfortunately, her father, the only bread earner for the family at time, suffered a severe stroke and expired 12 years ago. Sarita's elder brother took the responsibility of the family for few days but he also separated after marriage. Ultimately, the responsibility to take care of her old ailing mother and two young sisters had to be borne by Sarita. Having no alternative livelihood, she began working as daily a labourer.

Ultimately, the training and enterprise development support through THP changed her life forever. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she chose to set up cloth and garment shop in December 2017. She was provided readymade cloth of Rs. 4970/- and a tailoring machine of Bs 6034/- with total asset value of Rs. 11004/-. The program staffs supported her through regular mentoring and hand holding to develop and rise above the abject poverty. The program staff also visits her home weekly basis for asset follow up and monitors her business growth. She attends the

weekly group meeting, where she gains knowledge on social issues, enterprise development and business skills. She has also opened a bank account and makes a daily savings in a piggy bank which in every quarter she deposits in her savings account.

With hard work and support of THP staff, her asset value has increased to Rs. 25675/- at present and her monthly income is Rs. 4500/-. With perineal food security, access to public health services and other social security provisions, she is leading a contented life.

Rising above struggle with

determination

Mukta Sundi lives in Gidiyaburu village in Purnapani Gram Panchavat of Tonto block. Poverty compelled her to drop out in class VII and take up domestic responsibilities. Later at the age of 19 she was married to Krishna Sundi, who sold firewood for livelihood. However, as the family grew after birth of two sons, it became difficult to meet the needs of the family. So he decided to migrate to Vishakapatnam to earn better so that his family could lead a better life. However, just after one week at Vishakapatnam, Mukta's husband was murdered mysteriously, leaving behind devastated Mukta to fend for two sons. Considering her miserable situation, the villagers decided involve her in

cooking mid-day meal in local school for a living. This gave her some work but they struggled to lead a hand-to-mouth existence.

Mukta saw a silver lining when she was selected as a beneficiary in the THP Program. She underwent Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training, post which she was motivated to set up readymade garments enterprise for a livelihood. She was given readymade garments worth Rs. 10569/-. She sold the garments in nearby villages. The programme staff helped and mentored her to develop the requisite business skills and build her confidence. Weekly meetings also helped her to sharpen her skills.

Gradually, Mukta's confidence increased and her enterprise expanded. At present, the value of her assets is Bs 17590/- and her monthly income is Rs. 2840/-. She has also joined SHGs and has gained an understanding of financial literacy. As a result, she makes daily savings and deposits in bank on quarterly basis. She is now accessing public health services and social security scheme. She is also having Aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card. Her two sons are also studying in class VI and VII and she hopes to further expand her business and has ambition to educate her children for a brighter future.

Dream for Brighter Future

Nirale Tubid lives with her two children and differently able husband in Gundipusi village in Bamebasa Gram Panchavat of Tonto block She was born in a very poor family and studied up to class VI and due to extreme poverty could not continue schooling thereafter. She was married at the age of 21 to Krishana Tubid, a mason, She had a son and a daughter. One day Nirale's husband met with an accident and lost his both legs. It was shocking to both, leaving them baffled about rest of the life. She had no respite in sight and her hardships continued as she had bear the responsibility to feed the family. She worked as a labourer for livelihood. She tried

her best to continue the education of her children, but since she could not pay attention to them, they would remain absent frequently.

However, THP brought hope to her miserable life. She was selected as a beneficiary in the THP Program and underwent the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training. She expressed interest in setting up grocery enterprise for her livelihood. Considering her interest and determination, she was given grocery items worth Rs. 10284/-. With mentoring by THP staff and guidance through weekly group meetings, she was able to enhance her business

skills and gained confidence. This helped her to raise the asset value to Rs. 12170/- and her monthly income is Rs. 1720/-. She is now also a member of SHG group and accessing public health services. She is also having Aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card. She has also opened a bank account and deposits savings on quarterly basis. She is also able to pay adequate attention to education of her children and dreams of a brighter future for them.



Shuru Tubid lives with her two children, son is studying in class IX and one daughter is in class VII and lives in Hatimanda village in Bamebasa Gram Panchayat of Tonto lock. Born in a very poor family, whe was able to study till class IX dropped out thereafter to support in domestic work. She was married at the age of 16 to Sidiu Tubid, working as a labourer in Gujarat. After 11 years of marriage, Sidiu's husband was murdered in Gujarat and the news devastated the life of Shuru and her family. She was in great misery. Aggrieved Shuru had no way but to summon courage and keep going, with future of her two children in sight.

Shuru saw a ray of hope as she was selected as a beneficiary under the THP Program. She underwent the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training. Since she was interested in foot wear business and assessment indicated capabilities to run the enterprise, she was provided assets worth Bs 10019/- in the month of December 2017. The program staff, through regular mentoring and hand holding has been helping her to develop skills for managing the enterprise. She also attends the weekly group meetings, where she gains knowledge on social issues, enterprise development and

business skills. At present, her assets are valued at Rs 18500/and her average monthly income stands at Rs. 3640/-. She has also opened a bank account and has a savings of Rs. 1527/- from her income. She savings on daily basis and deposits it in bank account every three months, a habit cultivated after joining SHG. She not only has perennial food security, but also access to social security scheme, public health service and is using sanitary latrine. She has aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card also.

Not just an enterprise, but a promise for brighter future

Nandini, wife of Sashi Bhusan Hasda aged about 26 years is the resident of Bara Jhinkpani village of Bara Jhikpani Gram Panchayat in Tonto block She was born and brought up in a very poor family. She studied up to standard IX at her village school. When she was barely 16, she eloped with a local lad and married him Within a short span of her marriage, she gave birth to a child. Her husband worked as a daily labour, but his irregular income was not enough to support the family. Moreover, he also turned out to be an alcoholic and used most of his income on drinking. Over a period, he started falling sick frequently, until he was diagnosed with tuberculosis. Gradually he was no longer able to work. In such a situation, Nandini had to shoulder responsibility of her entire family. She began working as a daily wager to support her family.

In October 2017, she was selected as a THP beneficiary. She was provided with support to establish non-farm enterprise of grocery business with a asset of value Rs. 10947. She was also provided inputs for her enterprise development by way of training, building confidence, hand holding, market linkage, etc. Presently her asset value is Rs. 20220/- and cash in hand is

Rs.3050. Her monthly income is around Rs. 3500. She is also making regular savings.

She is able to send her child to school regularly and provide treatment to husband. She is in the process of linked up with Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) scheme. She is also linked with Self Help Group for better financial linkage.

Financial stability results in

better quality of life

Suru Laguri wife of Late Damu Laguri aged about 47 years is the resident of village Siringsia, GP Siringsia, block Tonto. She was was born and brought up in a very poor family. She was able to study up to class V was barely 16 when she was married off with a local agriculture labourer. She had two children at a very tender age. The income of her husband was mostly seasonal and was irregular. The earnings were not enough to support the family. Over a period, her husband was diagnosed with tuberculosis and passed away after prolonged illness. The illness had already drained her meagre resources.

Now responsible for the family, she took to labour work for a living. With the irregular meager income, she was barely able to meet even the basic needs.

In October 2017, she was selected as a THP beneficiary and this changed her situation significantly. She was provided support to establish enterprise of grocery business, with initial assets worth Rs,10234/-. The staff supported with regular mentoring and guidance for managing the enterprise and develop the requisite business skills. As a result, her present asset value is approximately Rs. 16000 with Rs.

2640 cash in hand. Her average monthly income is Rs. 3000. Having joined an SHG group, she also makes regular savings.

Financial stability has made her more confident and she is now leading a better life. She is being linked up with Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) scheme.

Socio-economic empowerment leads results in better life

Seema Hasda is single (never married) and lives with her family in Bara Jhinkpani village in Bara Jhinkpani Gram Panchavat of Tonto block. She was born in a poor, large family with 4 siblings. Her father worked as a migrant labourer, and found it very difficult to meet the needs of the family. As a result, Seema dropped out of school in class IX, to shoulder domestic responsibilities. Situation worsened when her father passed away and elder brothers separated after their marriage. However, Seema decided to remain unmarried and instead take up responsibility of her old mother and education of her two

sisters. Having no specific skills to opt for gainful livelihood, she began working as a labourer. Gradually, she found it difficult to meet the increasing needs and began feeling helpless.

But finally, several of her issues began resolving after she was brought under the fold of THP Program. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training, she opted for an enterprise of cosmetics and tailoring during October 2017. Through the programme, she was not only provided requisite assets worth Rs. 10328/- but also handholding support for

managing it successfully through both individual mentoring and weekly group meetings. At present, her asset value has increased to an Rs. 25.314/- and her average monthly income is Rs. 3660/-. She also joined SHG and makes regular savings which she deposits on quarterly basis in the bank account. She is also accessing public health services, has developed the habit of using sanitary latrine. She is also having Aadhaar card, ration card and voter ID. She has gained stability and hopes to expand her enterprise.

Belmati Hessa lives with her paralysed husband and daughter in Daodangua village in Kenjra Gram Panchayat of Tonto block. She studied up to class VIII and at the age of 17, was married to Paikaray Hessa. After 6 years of marriage, her husband fell ill and was paralysed for life. This came as a big blow to Belmati who was suddenly in a situation to bear responsibility of ailing husband and raising a daughter single handedly. With no other option she started to work as a daily labour and also used to collect sal leaves from the forest and sell in the local market.

Her life changed when she was selected as a beneficiary in the THP Program. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose an enterprise which will suit her. Her capacity was also judged and finally she chose selling rice and goat rearing as enterprise for her livelihood. She was given assets worth Rs. 10984/-. The program staff is helping her to develop requisite skills and handholding to keep her going. She attends the weekly group meeting, where she gains knowledge on social issues, enterprise development

and business skills. She has also opened a bank account and makes a daily savings in a piggy bank which in every quarter she deposits in her savings account.

By now, her asset has increased to an amount of Rs. 16050/- and her monthly income is Rs. 2280/-. With growing business, she expects to have higher monthly income over a period. She has been able to save Rs. 7000/- She is now also a member of SHG group, accessing public health service, using sanitary latrine. She is also having Aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card.

Instead, she was married at the age of 22 with Babulal Singh Kuntia, who worked in a cycle garage. She had four children at a very young age. In 2016, her husband passed away due to tuberculosis, leaving behind Mukta and her 4 small children to fend for themselves With small

children to take care of, she had no other alternative but to work as daily labourer.

Her luck changed when she was selected as a beneficiary in the THP Program, wherein she had opportunity for a more dignified livelihood. She was enrolled for Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training post which she was provided support for setting up readymade garments enterprise in December 2017. She was provided assets worth Rs. 10784/-. She sells the readymade garments in different villages and presently her asset has increased to an amount of Rs.

18860/- and her monthly income is Rs. 3460/-. Her present balance in savings account is Rs. 8947/-.

This was possible not only due to her hard work, but also due to the consistent handholding support of the program staff, guidance and motivation through weekly group meeting, improved financial literacy and regular savings through SHG and access to social security measures. She is able to send all four children to school and leading stable life free of misery and drudgery.

Kairi Tubid was born in a poor family. She studied up to class V and had to leave her studies due to extreme poverty and was involved in household chores. She had four children and to sustain her family she started to work as a daily labour, which was also irregular. All her four children were studying and she was in a miserable state due to drudgery from labour work.

She was selected as a beneficiary under the THP Program. After

receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose an enterprise and also on the basis of her capacity and understanding. Finally, she was interested in surf and soap business coupled with goat rearing. She was provided assets worth Bs 9954/- in the month of December 2017. The program staff supported through mentoring and hand holding She attends the weekly group meetings, where she gains knowledge on social issues, enterprise development and business skills. At present, value of her assets has increased to Rs. 18560/- and has 6 goats. Her monthly income stands at

Rs. 2528/-. She has also opened a bank account and has a savings of Rs. 3631/-.

Through the SHG she joined, she has gained better financial literacy and has developed a regular savings habit. She has access to public health service. She has Aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card also. All her four children are going to school. The disease claimed his life. leaving behind helpless Laxmi to fend for herself and her little son Her in-laws as discarded her and her situation began turning from bad to worse. She returned to her parents and began working as a daily wager. In the free time, she also attended tailoring training classes and learnt tailoring.

Laxmi's fate finally changed when she was selected as a beneficiary in the THP Program. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was asked to choose a suitable enterprise. Since she already knew tailoring, she opted for tailoring enterprise November 2017. She was provided assets worth Rs. 5834/-. at present her monthly income is Rs. 3800/-. The THP team supported her through regular mentoring and hand holding to develop and rise above the current situation She attended the weekly group meeting, where she gains knowledge on social issues,

enterprise development and business skills. She has also opened a bank account, and quarterly deposits have grown to Rs. 6050/-. Her son is also going to school regularly. She is now also a member of SHG group and accessing public health services, has developed the habit of using sanitary latrine. She is also having Aadhaar card, ration card and voter card

Malati Hessa lives with her child in Kenjra village in Kenjra Gram Panchayat of Tonto block. She studied up to class VIII and due to extreme poverty could not continue her schooling. She was married at the age of 17 to Defedar Hessa, a daily wager. After two years of marriage she had a daughter. However, after another year, her husband deserted her and remarried. This unexpected move left her helpless and lost. With a daughter to take care of and no other support available, she began working as a labourer.

Finally, her life changed when she was selected as a beneficiary

in the THP Program. She was enrolled in the training for Confidence Building and Enterprise Development. She was given a choice to opt for suitable enterprise. Her capacity was also judged and finally she chose grocery enterprise for her livelihood. She was given grocery items worth Rs. 11514/-. By now, her asset has increased to an amount of Rs. 16196/- and her monthly income is Rs. 2014/-. In order to progress to this stage. the program staff continued to mentor and handhold while the weekly group meeting kept her motivated to work hard with

persistence. She has also opened a bank account and makes a daily savings in a piggy bank which in every quarter she deposits in her savings account. She now has a bank balance of Rs. 5000/-.

She is also a member of SHG group, accessing public health service, using sanitary latrine and is covered under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY). She is also having Aadhaar card, ration card, voter card and job card. Once in a miserable situation, this single mother now has assured food security, steady income and able to take care of her little daughter.

Chandmuni Hasda lives with her family in Bara Jhinkpani village in Bara Jhinkpani Gram Panchayat of Tonto block. Due to abject poverty, she studied up to class IV only and dropped out. At the age of 17, she married Shatish Hasda, a daily wager. It turned out that he was an alcoholic and used to drink regularly. He was further diagnosed with Tuberculosis, unable to work anymore. She had no alternative left but to take up labour work to take care of the family. However, the meagre income she earned was not enough and they starved at times. The situation was gradually deteriorating and growing miserable day by day.

Chudamani's fate gave way to better days when she was selected as a beneficiary in the THP Program. After receiving the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training she was given option to choose a suitable enterprise. Her capacity was also judged and finally in November 2017, she was provided an asset of Rs. 2954/- for fast food business and Rs. 8340/- for 4 goats.

With consistent efforts, guidance and handholding by the THP staff and guidance through the weekly group meetings, her present asset value has increased to Rs. 20600/- with a monthly income

Made was selected as a beneficiary under the THP Program. Considering her capabilities, she was provided assets worth Rs. 10034/- for her pulses business and 2 goats in the month of November 2017. She was provided assets worth Rs. 12427/- for her surf and soap business and 3 goats in the month of December 2017.

Through regular mentoring, hand holding and monitoring support, the programme staff is helping her to develop requisite skills to manage the income generation activity. She attends the weekly group meetings, where she learns about social issues, enterprise development and business skills.

By now, her asset value has increased almost 4 times to an amount of Rs. 46616/- and her monthly income is Rs. 6288/-. She is mentored by THP staff to develop business skills and make progress. The weekly group meetings are also helpful in

At present, the enterprise value has grown to Rs. 16134/- and her monthly income is Rs. 3500/-. She has also opened a bank account and deposits quarterly in her savings account. At present she has a bank balance of Rs. 5000/-.

In order to develop business skills and confidence the program staff regularly visits and mentors

her. She also attends the weekly group meetings which sensitizes regarding social issues and helps in improving business skills also. She is able to provide for two full nutritious meal for her family and feels accomplished and happy for the same. She has access to public health services under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) and sanitation facility. She also has Aadhaar card, voter card, ration card and job card. to make two ends meet and continue schooling of her children.

Fulmunmi's struggle gave way when she was selected in the THP. She underwent the Confidence Building and Enterprise Development training. Thereafter, she was provided assets to set up a grocery enterprise worth Rs. 6856/- in October 2017. Presently her asset has grown to the tune of Rs. 13221/- and her monthly income is Rs. 3000/-. Having joined SHG, she also makes regular savings. In order to bring the enterprise at this stage, the programme staff

regularly extended mentoring and handholding support, while weekly meetings helped to gain the entrepreneurial skills.

With stable and increased income, Fulmuni's family is now able to lead a quality life. Her children are also going to the school regularly. She also has access to public health services covered under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojna (PMSBY) and has received her Aadhaar card, ration card and voter card to avail public scheme benefits

Few years laterm Putul was paralysed and to bear medical expenses, they sold the small piece of land they had. But his condition deteriorated and he became physically challenged. All their savings were drained in Kali's treatment. In order to sustain the family, Putul began working as daily labourer to feed her ailing husband and her two

sons. Managing two square meals a day for the family was difficult for her. Her sufferings and hardship continued as her elder son separated after marriage and her younger son dropped out of school.

Putul found a new hope for life after selection as beneficiary for the THP Program. She underwent the training and given her skills and interest, in the month of January 2018, she was provided raw material and 4 pigs worth Rs. 6080/-. Since then Putul's enterprise has shown immense growth and in just six months her

asset value has almost tripled to Rs 17,002/- and the number of pigs have increased to 7. Her monthly income is Rs. 3690/-. The program staff regularly mentors her, visits her home weekly basis for follow up and monitors business growth. She has also opened a bank account and deposits in the bank account every three months. She has encouraged her son to go to school again and is now leading a happy life with her family.
